Bernhard says. He also cites the influence of the homeowners, who were heavily involved in the design and construction process, as an asset, particularly when it came to material selections.

In the kitchen, a curvy double island allows the homeowners, who enjoy entertaining, enough room for socializing as they cook. The signature double island is also mimicked overhead by similarly boomerang-shaped floating ceiling panels. Each of the house's three bedrooms has its own bathroom, in addition to three more powder rooms scattered throughout the rest of the house. One bathroom is particularly distinctive for a light sculpture made with the same stretched white canvas used in the smaller sculptures by G.H.
